### **Erisman Sewing Circle Update**

July 2023

"Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me."

Erisman Sewing Circle continues to actively support Mennonite Central Committee with an average of 43 comforters a month - a total of 217 comforters in the first five months of 2023. We use donated fabric pieces and scraps that we turn into blocks, strips, and triangles to create lovely designs for the comforter tops. We need three and a half yards for each back. When you do the math, that means we use 150 yards of fabric a month just for the backs of our comforters.

Fortunately, we learned about a special sale at Joann's Fabrics on Memorial Day weekend and were able to buy \$10 flannel for \$2.99 a yard! We bought \$1,017.00 worth of flannel (340 yards) to make heavy weight comforters which are mostly sent to Ukraine and Iraq. Besides the 217 comforters sent to MCC so far this year, Sewing Circle also donated 24 infant care kits, 10 relief kits, and 26 hygiene kits. Other expenses include crochet thread for knotting comforters and \$450 for 10 rolls of batting every two to three months. We would like to send more relief kits this summer as funds allow.



This auction will feature a rich variety of written works relevant to both local and historical interests. Lots will


include Menno Simons' 1681 Opera Omnia


